Ref: Purple Heart City Signs IAW ADOT Standards

Following is direct information from Chapter 572's experiences with obtaining Purple Heart City Signs for the Cities of Sierra Vista, Benson and Hauchuca City, AZ.

Signage was procured from Zumar Industries, Glendale, AZ (reference order # 0022810). Zuma Industries can be contacted at (602) 252-7446 or info@zumar.com.

- Signs as produced to ADOT standards of 24" x 36"
- Made of high grade aluminum with 'traffic reflective' coating
- 2015 costs per sign \$72.00 (adjust for probable inflation)
- Both the Cities of Sierra Vista and Benson covered the costs of all signage, the City of Huachuca City required the Chapter to assist with 40% of costs
- The sign posts must meet the standards of the municipality, county or state highway of the location of the sign. These standards mostly adhere to ADOT standards, but not always - research should be done to avoid any violations.
- Sign posts have been obtained through the City Maintenance Departments
- ADOT states that the signs must be positioned a minimum of 4' from the shoulder of the road surface and where possible preferably 6', again this may vary depending on local standards
