

Bills in Congress

S. 302—the Captain Rafael Barbosa Enhanced Colorectal Cancer Screening Standard for Toxic Exposed Members of the Uniformed Services Act. S. 302 would authorize the Department of Defense (DOD) to provide service members who have been exposed to burn pits or other toxins with preventive colorectal screenings while on active duty. The Barbosa Act will help ensure that service members exposed to toxins will have the vital screenings to identify cancer while still on active duty. These early detections can save lives and ease access to VA health care and VA benefits after service. Please contact your senators to request their co-sponsorship and support of S. 302 to provide these cancer screenings after exposure to toxic environments.

H.R. 1529 and S. 777, the Veterans'

Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) Act of 2023. This would increase VA compensation benefit rates for veterans and those in receipt of Dependents Indemnity Compensation (DIC). Without annual COLAs, many disabled veterans may not be able to maintain the quality of life they deserve. We must ensure that veterans' benefits keep pace for the many veterans and survivors who are on fixed incomes and largely rely on their compensation payments for basic necessities. Please contact your Senators and Representative and urge them to co-sponsor and support the Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2023.

S. 132, the Daniel J. Harvey Jr. and Adam Lambert Improving Service Member Transition to Reduce Veteran Suicide Act, is to respond to this crisis among our newest generation of veterans. The bill would create a pilot project coordinated by VA and the Department of Defense to educate transitioning service members about challenges and risks of separating from service, including readjusting to their families and communities, and protective behaviors that may assist them in a successful transition. The bill would also provide a warm hand-off to a VA provider to screen individuals for risks, introduce them to appropriate VA services and provide them with contact information if they are likely to be eligible for services. Urge your Senators to cosponsor S. 132 or thank them for their support of this important legislation.

Support the Caring for Survivors Act (S. 414/H.R. 1083), bipartisan legislation that would ease the eligibility criteria for Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DIC) and increase the monthly benefit amount to match benefits provided by other federal survivor programs. Specifically, the measure would: expand eligibility for DIC by replacing the 10-year rule with a graduated scale of benefits that begins at five

Department Purple Heart Brick Program

Order a 4" x 8" Purple Heart Brick to be placed at Wesley Bolin Plaza at the State Capitol to commemorate being a Purple Heart recipient or order one to commemorate a family member or friend who received the Award. The cost of the brick, engraving, and


years for initial eligibility at 50% and gradually reaches the full benefit at 10 years after determination of disability. For example, if a veteran is rated as totally disabled for five years and dies of a nonservice-connected cause, a survivor would be entitled to 50% of the DIC benefit. Increase the amount of DIC to 55% of the rate of monthly compensation received by a totally disabled veteran. Consider contacting your Senators and Representative to co-sponsor the Caring for Survivors Act.

S. 344 and H.R. 1282: The Major Richard Star **Act** is legislation that would authorize concurrent receipt of Department of Defense (DoD) retired pay and Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) disability compensation for those injured in a combat zone and medically retired under Chapter 61 of title 10, United States Code. Currently, 50,000 military retirees with combat-related injuries qualify for retirement pay from both the DoD and for disability compensation from the VA for the injuries they sustained. However, for medically-retired veterans with less than 20 years of service, the amount of their disability compensation is deducted from their military retirement pay. The Major Richard Star Act would repeal this unfair offset, allowing combat-disabled veterans to receive both their medically retired pay and VA disability compensation benefits. Urge your Senators and Representative to

HB 2062 Vehicle license tax exemption for PH veterans:



On registration of a vehicle, if the veteran submits

satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is a veteran and a bona fide purple heart medal recipient and was honorably discharged vehicle registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.

VA Camp Lejeune Information

VA has established a presumptive service connection for Veterans, Reservists, and National Guard members exposed to contaminants in the water supply at Camp Lejeune from August 1, 1953 through December 31, 1987 who later developed one of the following eight diseases: Adult leukemia; Aplastic anemia and other myelodysplastic syndromes; Bladder cancer; Kidney cancer; Liver cancer; Multiple myeloma; Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma; & Parkinson's disease.
