


Robert J. Puskar Veterans Scholarship

Fame Society. This scholarship is named in honor of U.S. Marine Corps Captain **Robert J. Puskar** who fought gallantly during the siege of Khe Sanh and at Dong Ha, Vietnam from 1967 to 1968. Patriot Puskar served as the Department of Arizona Commander, Region VI commander & the National Commander. Our scholarship program is funded by \$2,500 donations from Bill and Karen Isaacson and Dottie Puskar.



Arizona is the Copper State, and an upright unsheathed sword is the symbol of exceptional bravery and leadership. The honoree was presented with a sword whose blade is comprised of copper in recognition of leadership and service to Arizona. This is the Society's highest award presented annually. The 2023 Copper Sword recipient is Lee Huff. Lee has a reputation across the State of Arizona for advocating for veterans through his hard work as a Veteran Constituent Services Representative for Congressman Andy Biggs & former representative Matt Salmon. For 13 years he has assisted hundreds of service members, veterans and their families obtain the healthcare, disability, and other benefits they so rightfully earned. Lee also developed the "Drop Zone, "a one-stop shop for veterans' services and benefits which has gained recognition as being the best Veteran Resource Fair in Arizona. Working with the Mesa Chamber of Commerce, Lee helped in the creation of the Mesa Veteran Resource Center and helped establish a Veteran Car Giveaway program which has provided vehicles to qualified veterans for the last eight years.

remember the sacrifice and service of those who gave all, but the month also holds several other military anniversaries and events, including Military Spouse Appreciation Day (5/8) and Armed Forces day (5/20).

Bills in Congress

SB.1266, the Love Lives on Act, would eliminate the remarriage age for survivors in receipt of Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DIC). For decades, surviving spouses were no longer eligible for DIC benefits if they remarried prior to the age of 57. Then in 2021, the remarriage age was lowered to 55. Surviving spouses that are currently in receipt of DIC benefits should not have to worry about losing their benefits if they remarry before the age of 55. Please urge your Senators to co-sponsor and support S. 1266.

S.326, Elizabeth Dole Veterans Programs Improvement Act of 2023 would consolidate provisions from the 5 bills: S. 106, the Commitment to Veteran Support and Outreach Act; S. 141, the Elizabeth Dole Home Care Act; S. 185, the Native American Direct Loan Improvement Act of 2023; S. 216, the RESPECT Act of 2023; S. 326, the VA Medicinal Cannabis Research Act of 2023. This bill if law would have a profound impact on the lives of veterans and their families helping to: improve outreach and assistance about veterans' benefits and services; expand long-term care options for aging veterans so they can live more independently with respect and dignity; create better home loan options for Native American veterans; and study the effects of medicinal cannabis on veterans with chronic pain or PTSD. Please urge your Senators to co-sponsor and support S.326.

H.R. 2414 and S. 1119, the CHAMPVA Children's Care Protection Act of 2023 would increase the maximum age for children eligible for medical care under the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs (CHAMPVA). When the Affordable Care Act was signed into law in 2010, it required private-sector health plans to allow children to stay on their parents' insurance until they are 26 years old, but this coverage was not extended to veteran health coverage. Currently a child of a veteran loses eligibility for CHAMPVA at age 18 if they are not a student, or at age 23 otherwise. Urge your senators and representative to provide extended health coverage for our nation's service-disabled veterans' children by supporting these bills.

S.928, the Not Just a Number Act, would require VA to produce and post an annual National Veteran Suicide Prevention report to include findings on suicide rates among veterans, information on their use of VA health care, Vet Centers and various VA benefits and services. The bill also would require information about veterans use of education programs, job training and housing utilization and an analysis of which benefits and services have the greatest impact on preventing suicide. The bill would require the VA to assess the possibility of moving the Office of Suicide Prevention to the Secretary's level. It will improve suicide data collection, reporting and analysis. Please urge your Senators to cosponsor S. 928.

H.R. 1606, the Veterans Entrepreneurship **Training Act,** will statutorily authorize the Boots to Business (B2B) program that helps transitioning service members to start and grow businesses. B2B is an entrepreneurial education and training program offered by the Small Business Administration as part of the Department of Defense's Transition Assistance Program (TAP). The B2B program offers transitioning service members and military spouses a foundational twoday, in-person course for an introduction to business ownership which can be followed by optional online courses. The Veteran Entrepreneurship Training Act would authorize the B2B program for five years. Please contact your Representative to request they co-sponsor H.R. 1606.

HB 2062 Vehicle license tax exemption for PH veterans:



On registration of a vehicle, if the veteran

submits satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is a veteran and a bona fide purple heart medal recipient and was honorably discharged vehicle registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.



Memorial Day holiday dates back to Civil War

Memorial Day is a United States federal holiday observed on the last Monday of May, which is May 31 this year.

Formerly known as Decoration Day, it commemorates U.S. men and women who died while in the military service.

Decoration Day was first enacted to honor Union soldiers of the American Civil War and was celebrated near the day of reunification after the Civil War.

The tombs of fallen Union soldiers were decorated in remembrance.

The first observance was in Waterloo, N.Y., on May 5, 1866.

The scope of the holiday was expanded after World War I.

The alternative name of Memorial Day was first used in 1882, but it did not become common until after World War II, and was not declared the official name by federal law until 1967.
