Life Member Verification

Every year, using the national roster as of June 30th, the Department and Chapter Commanders, helped by their adjutants and membership are responsible for **verifying the accuracy** of each individual person's membership profile. Surprise City Council Recognizes Chapter 691

At our Chapter meeting, members were briefed by Allison Wisniewski on the Surprise Veterans, Disability, and Human Services Commission's organization, mission, and functions. She is the Veterans Resource Coordinator who works in the City of Surprise, Surprise Resource Center. Allison relayed the plight of a disabled Veteran, David, she was attempting to help. He has had a water main leak between the meter and his house. Allison found a Veteran friendly Plumbing Company who offered a 20% discount for Veterans, but the nearly \$3,300 price was still something David could not pay for. Chapter 691 members immediately voted to provide \$1,000 toward the bill. Chapter Commander Leighton, past President of Corte Bella Vets, contacted them to see if they would also help with this bill. The leak was repaired! At their meeting on Tuesday, June 20th, the Surprise City Council recognized Chapter 691 and the Corte Bella Vets for their quick responses to help one of the cities disabled Veterans. 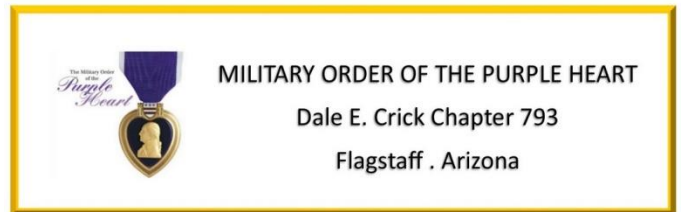

Bills in Congress

H.R. 3651—the Love Lives on Act. The Love Lives on Act in the Senate now has a companion bill in the House of Representatives. This legislation would eliminate the remarriage age for survivors in receipt of Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DIC). For decades, surviving spouses were not able to maintain their DIC if they remarried prior to the age of 55. The payment of DIC benefits provides surviving spouses with the means to maintain some semblance of economic

stability for themselves and their families. Please contact your Representative to co-sponsor and support H.R. 3651.

S. 1590 and H.R. 3790 - the Justice for ALS Veterans Act, would provide increased DIC payments to surviving spouses of veterans who die from ALS regardless of how long they had been rated as totally disabled prior to death. Current law allows an additional DIC monthly payment of \$331.84 to survivors in the case of a veteran, who at the time of death was in receipt of or was entitled to receive compensation for a service-connected disability that was rated totally disabling for a continuous period of at least eight years immediately preceding death. This extra compensation installment is commonly referred to as the DIC “kicker.” This bill would provide the survivors of veterans who die of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) the DIC (Dependency and Indemnity Compensation) “kicker” amount without meeting the required eight-year total disability rating time period. Urge your senator and representative to support this bill.

S. 1515, the Retired Pay Restoration Act would end the unfair policy of requiring certain qualified military retirees to forfeit some of their retired pay to receive equal amounts of disability compensation from the VA. This would allow certain qualified retirees, not covered under the Major Richard Star Act, entitlement to military retired pay and Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) disability compensation, beginning on January 1, 2024. This bill would also end the existing concurrent receipt phase-in period. Urge your senator to support S. 1515.

H.R. 41, the VA Same-Day Scheduling Act would require the VA Secretary to ensure when a veteran contacts the Department by telephone to schedule an appointment for care or services at any VA facility, the scheduling for the appointment occurs during that telephone call (regardless of the prospective date of the appointment being scheduled). This bill would improve current scheduling procedures and require real-time scheduling practices that ensure more timely access to VA health care services. Contact your Representative and urge him or her to co-sponsor and support H.R. 41, the VA Same-Day Scheduling Act.

HB 2062 Vehicle license tax exemption for PH veterans:



On registration of a vehicle, if the veteran submits satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is a veteran and a bona fide purple heart medal recipient and was honorably discharged vehicle registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.

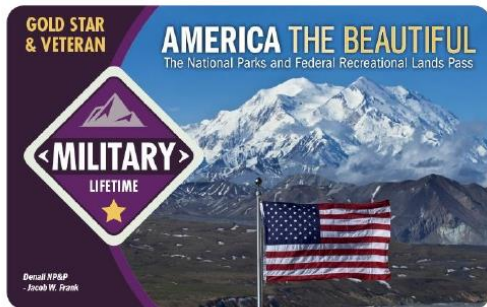

U.S. stamp honors the Purple Heart

It's a funny story, actually, begins Dominic Di Giovanni on why he has a Purple Heart medal.

He was 18 and in the Army and one of the first servicemen in Korea. His commander told him to start driving until he was shot at, then note the mileage and return to camp.

On July 4, 1950, a bullet came through the windshield, 7 1/2 miles out, and went through his arm that was draped over the back of the seat.

"Had I had both hands on the steering wheel, like I should have, I would have been OK," said Di Giovanni, a Sun Lakes resident and retired clinical psychologist.

A few butterfly bandages — no one was available to suture the wound — and Di Giovanni was back in the fray. Since World War I, about 1.5 million U.S. military men and women have been wounded or killed in combat and received a Purple Heart. About one-third of the Purple Heart recipients are still living.

Today, the medal will be commemorated with the release of the Purple Heart postage stamp, thanks to the efforts of Di Giovanni and other members of the Military Order of the Purple Heart who have spent years lobbying the U.S.
