

MESSAGE FROM THE VA DEPUTY SECRETARY

Planning for Potential Lapse in Funding: As many of you are aware, annual funding for much of the Government expires on September 30, 2023. The Administration will continue working with the Congress to complete appropriations for Fiscal Year 2024. We at VA are preparing for all contingencies, including the possibility that a lapse in funding could occur. A lapse would mean that certain Government activities would cease due to a lack of appropriate funding, and that designated pre-notified employees of this agency would be temporarily furloughed. We've prepared a contingency plan to execute an orderly shutdown of activities that would be affected by such a lapse. After the lapse ends, furloughed and excepted employees will receive retroactive pay for the furlough period as soon as possible. Most VA operations will continue without interruption if there is a shutdown. Health care through the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) and mandatory benefit payments to Veterans are funded through an advance appropriation. In addition, certain programs meet legal requirements to continue performing their designated duties and are considered "excepted." These include benefits processing at the Veterans Benefits Administration; interments through the National Cemetery Administration; and certain information technology functions at the Office of Information and Technology. The Department's Fiscal Year 2024 projection is that 97% of VA employees would be fully funded or continue to perform excepted functions during a shutdown. 407,599 (out of a pre-shutdown total of 456,067) VA employees are VHA employees funded by advance appropriations or multi-year appropriations. Others are considered "excepted." The total projected number of employees who would continue to report to work is 440,437. The 15,620 employees that are not exempted will continue to work until the carryover funds are depleted, then be furloughed.

During the final ceremony, we were all sitting on a stage, and he tried to straighten his jacket collar when the guest speaker, a 4-star General reached over and helped him, the master of ceremonies commented that our 99-year-old was most likely the only private that ever had a 4-star General for an aide.

The University of Arizona is a Purple Heart University. At our chapter meeting **Mr. Bruce** Grissom, Director of Veterans Education & Transition Services at the UofA, spoke to the chapter. Mr Grissom highlighted the services and programs provided to the 5,500 veterans and military students at the university. The Arizona Tuition Waiver program provides eligible Purple Heart recipients with a tuition-free education (up to a Bachelor's degree) at the university. Eligibility is a current member of the Arizona National Guard who received a Purple Heart Citation after 09/11/01. Or a person who is a former member of the United States Armed Forces who received a Purple Heart AND was an Arizona resident or stationed in Arizona at the time of the injury that resulted in the Purple Heart AND has a VA disability rating of 50% or more.

Bills in Congress

H.R. 2818, the Autonomy for Disabled

Veterans Act, would increase the amount of funding available to disabled veterans for improvements and structural alterations provided to them for home improvements related to their disability. Rates have not been adjusted since 2010.

Patriots Stephan Bobby & James Sparkman recently installed additional PH memorial bricks that had been purchased for installation at the memorial at Wesley-Bolin Plaza at the state capitol.



However, the cost of home modifications and labor has risen more than 40% since then.

This legislation would increase the amount of funding for VA grants for disabled veterans to make necessary modifications to their homes to fit their needs, including wheelchair ramps, structural changes, medical equipment, and would adjust the amount to account for inflation.

HB 2062 Vehicle license tax exemption for PH veterans: Many of our members are still not aware of this benefit. On



registration of a vehicle, if the veteran submits satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is a veteran and a bona fide Purple Heart medal recipient and was honorably discharged vehicle registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.
