Veteran homelessness is a pressing issue that affects not only the individuals who have served our country but also our society. According to the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans, on any given night, there are over 37,000 veterans experiencing homelessness in the United States. This number represents a staggering 11% of the total homeless population, despite veterans making up only 7% of the general population.

The reasons for veteran homelessness are complex and multifaceted. Many veterans struggle with PTSD, traumatic brain injury, and other mental health issues that can make it difficult to maintain stable housing. Additionally, the transition from military to civilian life can be challenging, leading to unemployment, poverty, and family separation. The lack of affordable housing, inadequate mental health services, and limited access to healthcare also contribute to the problem. Solving veteran homelessness is not only our patriotic moral obligation, but it is also essential to the well-being of our society. As the adage goes, "we are only as strong as our weakest link." Veteran homelessness is a vulnerability that affects us all, and addressing it is crucial to upholding the social contract we have with those who have served our country.

Tanner Thomas Village for Veterans will be a beacon of hope and a necessary haven in the Phoenix region, providing a safe and supportive community for our nation's heroes. As veteran homelessness continues to rise, this vital endeavor starts at 06:30 AM and the event starts at 7:00 AM on Saturday, August 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Lehi Community Center in Mesa (1231 E. 





HB 2062 Vehicle license tax exemption for PH veterans: Many of our members are still not aware

of this benefit. On registration of a vehicle, if the veteran submits satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is



a veteran and a bona fide Purple Heart medal recipient and was honorably discharged vehicle registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.

The Veterans Spinal Trauma Access to New Devices (STAND) Act (H.R. 6373/S. 4009) seeks to enhance health care for veterans with spinal cord injuries by mandating that VA offer them annual yearly preventative health evaluations for the purpose of improving consideration of and accessibility to assistive technologies that could help maximize their independence and mobility when medically appropriate. There are close to 42,000 veterans with spinal cord injuries (SCI). New assistive technologies like the exoskeleton can empower certain individuals with spinal cord injury to stand, walk, turn, and navigate stairs, which can enhance their health, socialization, independence, and participation in community activities.

H.R. 3644, the Addressing Care Timelines (ACT) for Veterans Act would provide an additional 24-hour period for veterans to inform the VA when receiving care at a non-VA facility under the Veterans Community Care Program. Currently, a veteran must contact the VA within 72 hours of receiving non-VA emergency care; otherwise VA may deny payment for these services even if the veteran is eligible for treatment. Veterans suffering medical emergencies should not have to worry about whether VA will deny coverage or refuse payment because of administrative notification time requirements.

Contact your representative and urge them to cosponsor and support H. R. 3644, the ACT for Veterans Act.

The Veterans Cannabis Analysis, Research, and Effectiveness (CARE) Act would require the VA to conduct and support research on medicinal cannabis for treating veterans with PTSD, chronic pain, and other conditions. Our nation's veterans deserve access to the most effective treatments available, including alternative options available under the law. Currently veterans can talk about their cannabis use with their medical provider, however, VA clinicians are not permitted to provide veterans recommendations or prescriptions for medical cannabis. It is imperative that safe and effective innovations for the purpose of delivering new evidence-based treatments to improve veterans' health and quality of life are available.

Contact your representatives and urge them to co-sponsor and support H.R. 3584, the CARE Act.

H.R. 3225, the BUILD for Veterans Act, aims to enhance the VA's capital asset program by improving planning and oversight, providing more consistent funding, and strengthening capabilities to start and complete projects to better serve veterans, their families, caregivers, and survivors. For VA to maintain its role as the primary provider of timely and quality care, it must address the challenge of an aging infrastructure through the construction and modernization of facilities. Unfortunately, VA medical facilities have a median age of nearly 60 years. Facilities this old were not designed to accommodate the technological and design innovation needs that support modern health care delivery systems.

The Veterans Flight Training Responsibility Act of 2024 (H.R. 7613) would help veterans who want to become airline or commercial pilots to overcome a potential employment barrier by authorizing the VA to pay a public institution of higher learning up to \$100,000 for a veteran enrolled in flight training. This would remove the current restriction and cap of \$26,000 per academic year. There are about 16,800 projected openings for airline and commercial pilots each year. These positions make great career opportunities for veterans following military service. However, costs for flight training can be expensive and act as a deterrent for seeking this career path.
